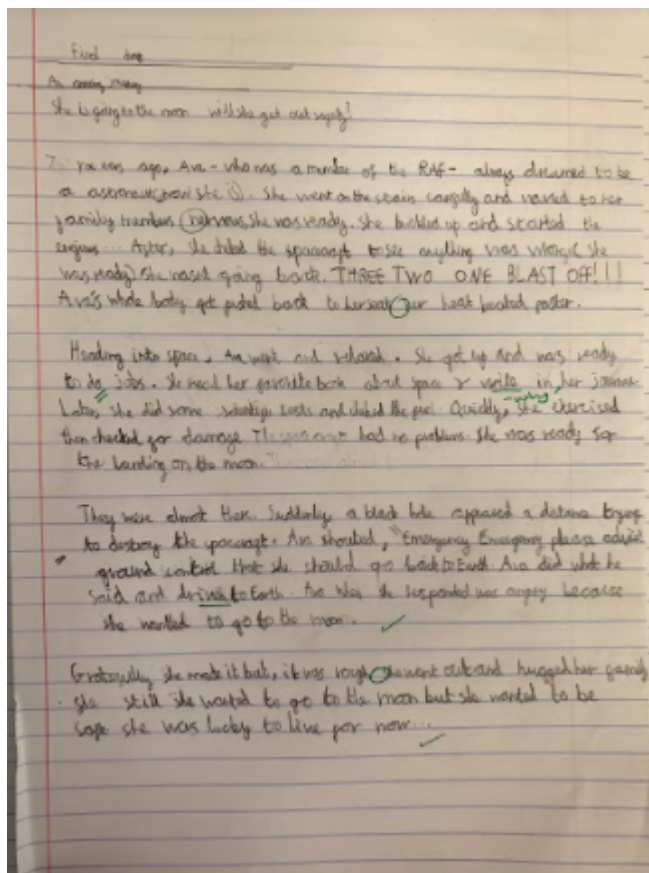

In investigation, the results show that the youngest or the oldest but we are just young and old so you just should respect the seniors.

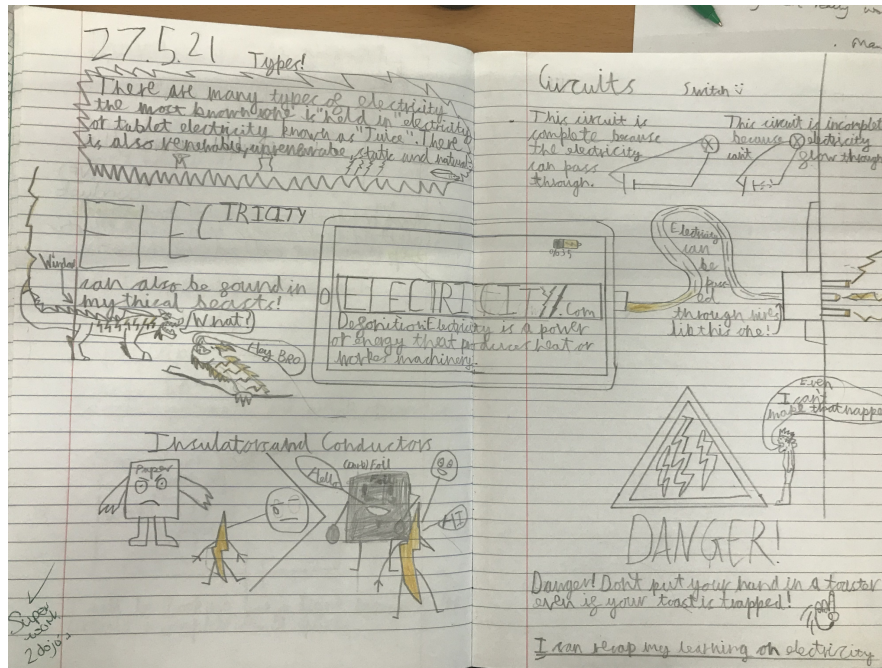
In investigation, the results show that the results are similar because you just need to check the big letters.

They could be improved by doing more tests and practice in 1 and 2 you could try checking basically without it.

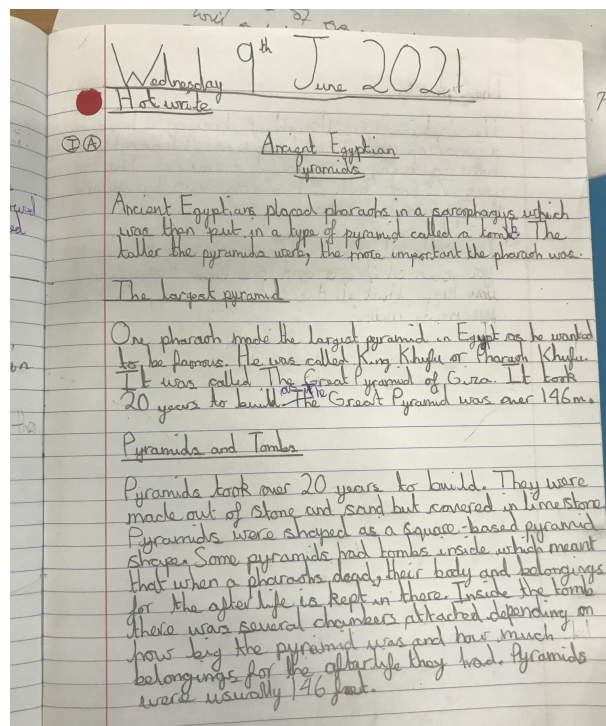
Ethan has been trying so hard to improve his presentation. Well done, Ethan! Keep up the great work.

## Fantastic Work - Year 4

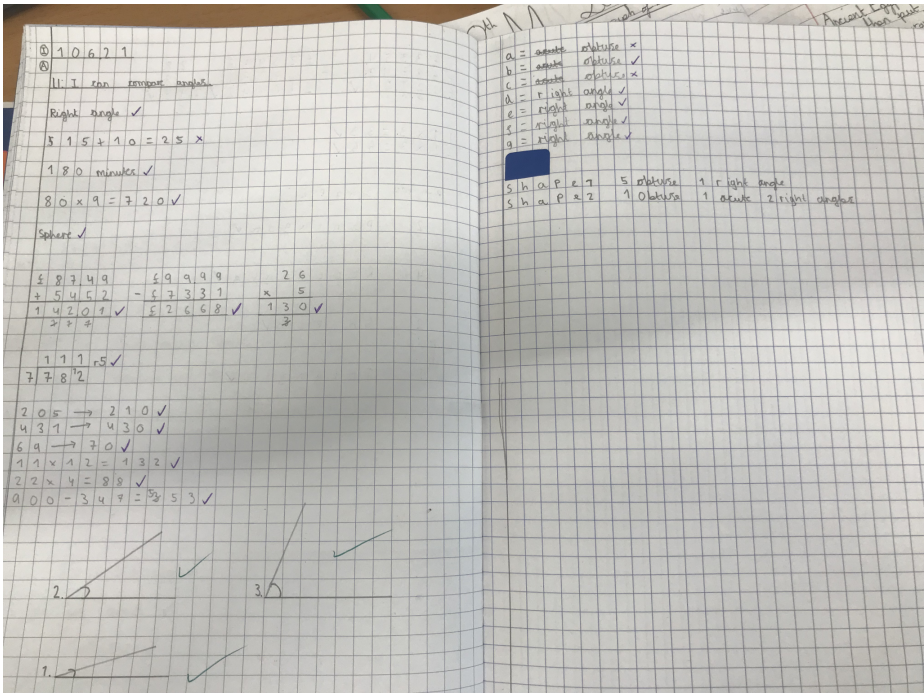
To finish our science topic on electricity the children created an information text demonstrating their knowledge and understanding of the unit. This is Samuel's work.
