This year, more than ever, there is a tangible sense of excitement as we enter Advent time. As we look around the local neighbourhood there are many festive lights and displays already being put up in houses and gardens, and our children are regularly heard talking excitedly about the arrival of the Christmas period. As a school we ensure that children understand that Advent is an important part of the Christian calendar. Advent means 'coming' and is the period before Christmas which celebrates the birth of Jesus. Advent is all about preparing for Christmas Day. This year, Advent will start on Sunday November 29th, and will finish on December 24th. In school the children will have an Advent candle in each class, which helps the children to understand the idea of 'counting down to Christmas', while reminding them that the celebration of Christmas is about the celebration of the arrival of Jesus, the light of the world. 

This Week's Great Work!

Year 3

This week, Year 3 have been focusing on multiplication and division. We have recapped the 2, 5 and 10 times tables and learnt different ways to calculate a multiplication and division number sentence. We have used cubes, drawings and counting in multiples to help us. We are now beginning to learn the 3 times tables. To support this, we ask that children are practicing their times tables at home and login to their Times Tables Rockstars. Here are some great examples by Isaac and Lacey.

There are 2 equal groups of 5.		$5 + 5 = 10$	$2 \times 5 = 10$


Year 4

In P.E this term we are following a dance unit based on the Vikings. Children are working hard to create a short motif based on the Vikings as invaders. They have had to choreograph 4 different movements each with a count of 8. They are practicing ready for a performance to the rest of their class.

This week, the children have been learning to code using 'if' and 'if/else' on Purple Mash. They have managed to create a code that can ask a question and reply with a number of responses. Year 5 have also been really testing their bodies this week with a variety of yoga positions in our PE lessons. The cat/cow pose is very popular.




Information for Parents

Our Behaviour Policy

We have had a very positive reaction from our children about our new behaviour policy and system that has been running since September. Here is a brief synopsis for our parents about our behaviour policy.

- Our approach is centred around reinforcing and rewarding positive behaviour choices through a behaviour rainbow, verbal praise and ClassDojo.
- Around school, children are given regular, specific praise for positive behaviour. The reward system is designed to celebrate and encourage the skills and traits that are needed for children to develop a positive attitude towards their learning and development and to support them to become responsible members of the school community.
- Every child has a named peg and they start on 'Ready to Learn' (green) at the start of each day.
- Children who are rewarded for positive behaviour receive verbal praise and are moved up (clipped up) the behaviour rainbow.
- The aim is to get to 'Outstanding' which is when the child 'clips off' and clips their peg onto their collar or tie. This is to show the rest of the school community that they have displayed outstanding behaviour throughout the day. When this happens, the child earns 5 points on the ClassDojo.
- Children can also earn additional points on the ClassDojo for showing our school values.


Nativity Scene Project
