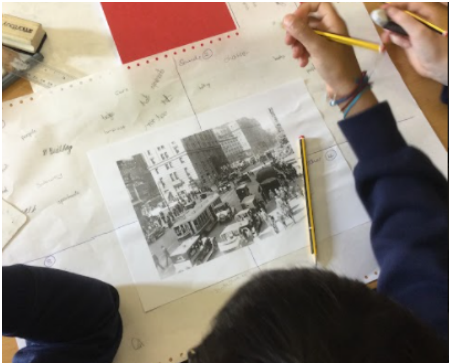

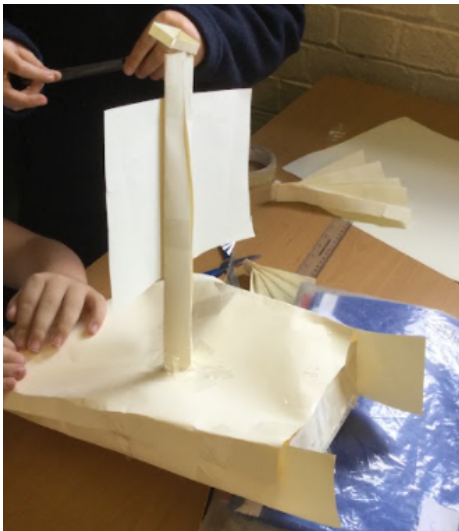

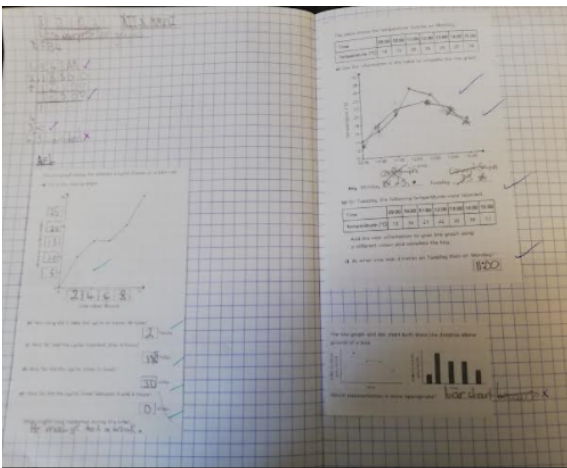


Great Work Year 5!

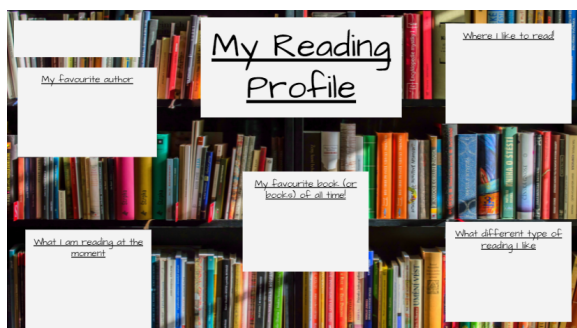


House Sports Competition
